The children practised their dressage test for the following day before the ponies were turned out for a few hours. Tack and boots were cleaned and checked before being loaded back onto the lorry. Once afternoon jobs were completed the ponies were brought in and bathed before Sarah plaited them both up and they were fed and bedded down for the night.

After jumping it was back to the lorry again for a change of boots for cross country. Both riders had great rounds cross country with both of them completing the 100U18s course. We headed back to the lorry for the final time to wash both ponies off and rug up before popping them both back on the box to relax. We waited for prize giving as they were both placed. Ellie was 9th in her section and Finn was 8th in his later.

we arrived back at the yard where we unloaded Casper and Jack who were checked over before being turned out for a leg stretch after a busy day. On Saturday 13 May I competed my own horse Ice Cool Lady in the AE90 at Chatsworth Horse Trials. It was lovely to be able to compete at such a great event, the atmosphere was fantastic! On the Sunday it was back to Chatsworth to see how things work behind the scenes as opposed to being a competitor. I was set to work in the Organiser's Office answering queries from riders, grooms and the general public, and I also had to run a few errands. Thank you SCT for organising these days, as I benefited from both experiences. I met lots of lovely people who were happy to share their knowledge and I learnt a lot that I can definitely take with me into the future.

#### NIAMH HOROBIN - CHATSWORTH HORSE TRIALS



I started my Apprenticeship at SCT 3 months ago and have had so many amazing opportunities already. In May I helped with setting up for I Chatsworth International Horse Trials doing the 11 dressage arenas. There were 4 broken arenas where the boards were at each letter, two 20x40 and 2 20x60. With the 20 by 60 arenas there were 12 letters around the outside. A had to be 10 metres away on the centre line, down the long



side K had to be 6m away from the corner, V at 18m, E at 30m, S at 42m, H at 54m and the C had to be 10m along the 20m side and the same measurements along the other side. All the letters had to be 50cm away from the board. We also had to put red tape on each board in front of the letters. We had 6 solid arenas to set up which were all 20x60, it was so important that we had all the measurements correct. When setting the arenas up we had to lay ropes along the floor and had to use tape measures to make sure that they were the correct length. On the 20x40 arenas the diagonal had to be 44.72m from corner to corner and on the 20x60 arenas the diagonal had to be 63.25m. On the Friday I was stewarding on the main arena so I had one of the best spots because I could see all the 3\* dressage tests. I was doing the gate so I would move the gate when the judges pressed the horn, then as soon as the horse entered the arena I would put the gate up and move away from the arena. It was great to see all competitors ride including Zara Tindall, see how their horses reacted, and watch how they all did the test. I had a lovely time setting up Chatsworth and working there and would love to do it all again, and am very lucky to have had all the opportunities which I have had so far in my apprenticeship.



lizabeth Mellor is the first winner of SC Enterprise Award, which was founded to reward apprentices who "go the extra mile" in helping the businesses in which they are employed t be successful. The award was supported by the British Equestrian Federation (BEF). Three apprentices - Elizabeth, April Brereton and Katie Leech - were selected to go forward for the final

judging by Sarah Armstrong, performance director of the BEF's World Class programme, at Chatsworth International Horse Trials on 14 May, Sarah was highly impressed by all three candidates, but chose 18-year-old Elizabeth. who is employed by Hood Hill Farm livery stables in Sheffield. "All three had put a lot of work into their submissions, but Elizabeth's shone. Her thoughtfulness

and very thorough approach made her a clear winner," said Sarah. "Overall, the quality from a group of people just starting out in the workplace showed some great ideas, a dedicated approach to their work and a clear passion for the equestrian industry." Elizabeth's prize is a place on the BEF's prestigious three-day "Business of Equestrian" programme in Newmarket in October. She will receive training from leading experts on running an equestrian business, including health and safety, employment law, owner relationships and contracts, and managing staff and performance. Elizabeth said: "Winning the SCT Enterprise Award has given me so much more confidence and self-esteem, knowing that if I set my mind to achieve something. I can. It shows that hard work pays off. My employer, Josie Gibbs, was delighted to hear I had won, and I hope to carry on making her proud during the time I work for her.
